

In Art class, the kindergarten, first and second graders have been learning about primary and secondary colors as well as warm and cool colors. Students have made "stained glass" fish using primary colors of tissue paper to decorate our classroom.

First and second graders have made leaf rubbings using crayon and watercolors.

Third-sixth graders have been learning about how to use line to create movement, in addition to color theory. We started the year with a curved line and watercolor landscape. We are currently working on an optical art project.

SCIENCE Mrs. Them

Kindergarteners: God is the maker of all Life - how they eat, breath and grow. They also learned about weather and how all seasons begin and end with God's hand.

First & Second grade: Will it dissolve? Making a scientific guess. God creates unique attributes for His creation to survive and thrive. They learned all about spiders.

Third & Fourth grade: God is unique in creation. They studied and classified fingerprints and learned about states of matter; solids, gases and liquids with root beer floats

Fifth & Sixth grade learned about the states of matter with root beer floats too. We discussed: 1. Physical vs chemical changes and how molecules are rearranged and new combinations are made 2. Physical changes can be reversed and chemical changes cannot. They did a physical change: icewater- steam and a chemical change: hydrogen peroxide, yeast and dish soap.
