## **How to Apply**

NORTH CENTRAL STATE COLLEGE WILL REQUIRE THAT ALL APPLICATION MATERIALS (INCLUDING APPROPRIATE TEST SCORES) BE SUBMITTED NO LATER THAN 30 DAYS BEFORE THE SEMESTER BEGINS.

- Attend your school district's CCP Information Meeting. Contact your district for details.
- Complete the College Credit Plus application to North Central State College
- Submit a high school transcript or middle school report card.
- Demonstrate qualifying test scores: Submission of the Reading score is required. Math and English scores may be required depending on individual course selection. Qualifying scores: ACT Reading (21), Math (21-28) depending on individual course selection, English (18) for English Composition I. The college's Compass or ACCUPLACER test can also qualify. - Submit a completed CCP Authorization & Advising form (requires signature of guidance counselor, student, and parent). Once accepted you will receive a letter of acceptance and registration instructions.
- A MANDATORY ORIENTATION will be held for all new students taking courses at a NCSC campus or online.
