### **Science:**

Junior High, 3:15-4:35 PM with Mrs. Heininger

Students will study important General Science topics from a Biblical Perspective through Apologia curriculums. Students will spend extra time in both chemistry and physics exploring the basic building blocks of creation and their interactions together.

High School 9-12; 4:40-6:00 PM with Mrs. Shepherd

Biology is a systematic study of the fundamental biological principles from a creationist's position. This course looks at God's truth and science, organic chemistry, cellular structure and function, history of life, genetics, and classification. During the second semester, students will examine the kingdoms of life with special emphasis on plants and animals. Students will also be introduced to the science of ecology, which includes ecosystems, the biosphere, and the biomes of the world.

### **English Language Arts:**

5th and 6th Grade, 12:45 PM-2 PM with Mrs. Feia

IEW theme-based writing course--ALL THINGS FUN AND FASCINATING. This course includes humorous characters, cunning creatures, and meritorious men of history that will captivate students. Students will learn how to take notes, summarize narrative stories, write from pictures, put together a mini research report, and compose creative essays. Vocabulary and Grammar included. \*\* This option may be edited as Mrs. Feia and Mrs. Winkler are planning a possible collaboration during second semester with STEM and literature.

Junior High, 4:40-6:00 PM with Mrs. Feia

Prentice Hall textbook will be used to study classic literature appropriate to junior high students. We will also read Corrie ten Boom's THE HIDING PLACE. Vocabulary and Grammar included.

High School, 3:15-4:35 PM with Mrs. Feia

Prentice Hall American Literature textbook will navigate students through poetry, short stories, novels, and drama. Students will compare and contrast author philosophies with Christianity. Writing projects and oral presentations will spring out of our study of literature. Vocabulary and Grammar included.
